Sudden Cardiac arrest – it can happen to anyone, anywhere. And when it strikes, survival is directly linked to the time it takes to begin CPR and defibrillate the patient (AED). Every minute delay reduces the chance of survival by 10%. In a remote area like ours it can take well over an hour for an ambulance to arrive at the scene of a cardiac or airway emergency.

This is why the GCC Community First Responder Scheme was set up.

How it works;

On receiving a 112/999 call Ambulance Control will dispatch an ambulance to the patient while also dispatching the local First Responders to administer CPR and/or AED as required until the arrival of the ambulance, thereby increasing the chance of survival for the patient.





The GCC scheme have trained volunteer Responders generously giving of their time each month.

To keep our scheme strong and able to respond to emergencies locally, we need your help.
